

Tenafly Historic Preservation Commission is pleased to announce a new publication entitled "**A Tour with Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony**". The 30-page booklet presents a new walking tour featuring 12 locations in Tenafly associated with the famed suffragists as described in their diaries and papers.

The book is free to the public; copies may be picked up at Tenafly Borough Hall or the Tenafly Public Library.

Stanton lived in Tenafly from 1868 until 1887 and completed her landmark History of Woman's Suffrage while working from her home on Highwood Avenue. She and Susan B. Anthony spent much time together here, in what was then the village of Tenafly within Palisades Township. Tenafly Railroad Station was critical to their mission and livelihood; the women traveled extensively by train, making many trips to Washington and across the country to campaign for the expansion of voting rights to all citizens.
