TENAFLY GETS A MEDICINE DROP BOX

The Tenafly Police Department is pleased to announce the unveiling of its new medicine drop box. The department received the box free of charge from the Division of Consumer Affairs of the New Jersey Attorney General's Office. The drop box is located in the front lobby of the police department and can be accessed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. All deposits can be made anonymously.

The following materials accepted at the medicine drop box:

- Household medications only
- Pills, capsules, patches, and pet medications
- Pill Bottles, but cardboard packaging should be discarded elsewhere
- **Mail, trash, syringes or liquids are NOT ACCEPTED**

While the proper disposal of prescription medication is beneficial to the environment, the main purpose of the drop box is to remove dangerous medicines from our homes and medicine cabinets that are no longer needed. The goal is to eliminate the opportunity to misuse the medications by the person prescribed the medication who no longer needs it, by other household members, or by visitors (i.e. relatives, friends, guests, contractors, etc.) to your home who may be looking to use or sell them. Do not save medication, especially pain medication, for a rainy day ache or future injury. Discard them when the specific injury, procedure, or medical issue for which the medication was originally prescribed, no longer requires the need to take them.


TNC will present a series of free lectures and roundtable discussions to address residents’ environmental concerns. Working with Tenafly’s Environmental Commission & Green Team to plan the series, TNC Education Director Debora Davidson suggested topics drawn from the most common questions fielded by TNC staff. The lecture series will help to qualify the Borough to renew its Sustainable NJ certification at the Silver Level.

The Things That Bug You-Ticks & Mosquitoes- July 2

Learn about flying, crawling and creeping creatures in our backyards and woods. Find out the truth about ticks and how to handle them. Biology Professor Stephen Vail at William Paterson University will offer his expertise on ticks and Lyme disease.

Invasive Species (plants & animals), August 6

Explore non-native species that grow in our area with Nancy Slowik, invasive species specialist. Non-native plants, animals, and pathogens cause economic, environmental harm and can threaten human health. Learn where they come from and how we can reduce their harm.



Backyard Birds – September 3

Learn about backyard birds and how to identify them. Learn which birds might visit backyard feeders and which ones can stay for the winter. Find out which types of food will attract different species. Don Torino from Bergen County Audubon will share his extensive knowledge of birds with attendees.

Recycling/Compost, October 1

- What happens to our recycling?
- How can we maximize our recycling efforts?
- What are the advantages of composting?
- What happens when we compost our fruit and vegetable waste?

Learn the answers to these questions and find out how to create your own backyard compost area.

Caring for Shade Trees, November 5

Trees are treasured for their beauty, shade and oxygen. When trees become victims of storms or old age they can cause property damage or hazards. Learn how to take care of your trees and identify a possible threats. A local shade tree expert will clarify these issues and help you understand when to seek an expert’s advice .





TENAFLY WELCOME! COMMITTEE

SCHOOL’S OUT—SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

While motorists need to drive lawfully and carefully all of the time, we’re asking that they pay extra attention during the summer months while kids are out of school enjoying a variety of summer activities.

1. **Be on the lookout.** Pay close attention at crosswalks near ball fields, playgrounds, downtown, and areas that children frequent.
2. **Share the road.** Be mindful that cyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as motor vehicles do. Be mindful of pedestrian rights and laws. Be watchful for kids and cyclists that dart out into the roadway.
3. **Be careful in and around the schools.** Every school has a playground, and a couple of schools will be hosting the Recreation Department’s summer camp as well as enrichment programs.
4. **Pedestrians – be alert and be seen.** Use sidewalks. If there is no sidewalk, pedestrians (walkers and joggers) need to face vehicular traffic in order to be able to avoid a vehicle that doesn’t see them or is drifting toward them.
5. **Cyclists – be alert, be seen, and abide by the rules of the road.** State law requires every rider under 17 years of age to wear a helmet, however, all cyclists are strongly encouraged to wear a helmet. Cyclists are required to abide by the laws and rules of the traffic code. That means stopping at stop signs, stopping and remaining stopped at red lights, riding single file and no more than two abreast when passing another rider to name some of the most common complaints and violations that we see and receive. Wear bright colors so cars can see you.
6. **No Fireworks.** Fireworks are illegal in the State of New Jersey. Just because they were purchased legally in another State does not make them legal here. Not only are they extremely dangerous due to the injuries they can deliver or the fire hazard they bring with them, but they terrify people and animals as well.
7. **Underage Alcohol Consumption Responsibility.** With the vacation season fast approaching and the increased chance of a high school or college-age teenager remaining at home alone, remember your responsibility to prevent underage alcohol consumption in your home, and the civil liability you bear in the event someone is hurt, or worse.
