IMPORTANT NOTICE TO REGISTERED VOTERS: SOME POLLING PLACE LOCATIONS HAVE CHANGED

Throughout the past few elections, accessibility concerns have been raised regarding the current voting districts. In order to remain compliant with the federal Help America Vote Act (HAVA) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), as well as with NJSA Title 19, there have been changes made to the majority of the voting districts in the Borough of Tenafly. These changes will be in effect for the General Election that takes place on Tuesday, November 3, 2015.

Have You Heard? ...

- ◆ On Saturday, October 24 and Sunday, October 25 there will be an art exhibition in Davis-Johnson Park from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. A number of local area artists will show their work in a variety of media and styles. These include pen and ink and graphite drawings, as well as large scale macro-photography. Admission is free; the event is indoors and will be held rain or shine. Many works, including unframed pieces and reproduction prints, will be offered for sale. Davis-Johnson Park is located at 137 Engle Street at the corner of Westervelt Avenue.
- ◆ Construction on *Special Homes for Very Special People*, the project being constructed on Tenaflly Road by the Bergen County United Way, in partnership with the Borough of Tenaflly, is on schedule and hopefully will be completed by the end of the year. Tenaflly residents will have a unique opportunity to become part of this project by helping to furnish six garden apartments being provided for people with developmental disabilities. - ◆ Our Skate Park was recently closed for repairs. Although some of the repairs were due to normal wear and tear, misuse of the park creates additional problems and closures. Skate Park users are urged to follow the rules posted on the fence and encourage their friends to do the same.
- ◆ This spring our DPW planted over 100 trees throughout Tenaflly at locations including schools, parks, and in front of residents' homes at their request. The original schedule was to continue planting during the fall season, but current drought conditions have made planting trees impractical at this time. We will continue the tree planting program next spring.
- ◆ Residents who arrived early for our Fireworks Show on July 2 were entertained by the Bergen County Police Pipes and Drums, a terrific bagpipe band manned by Bergen County Police officers. The band is planning to attend the 75th anniversary of Pearl Harbor in 2016. Anyone who wishes to donate to help cover the expenses of this trip should send a check made payable to the "Bergen County Police Pipes and Drums" to Borough Hall, attention the Mayor's office.

ELECTION INFORMATION

This year's General Election will be held on November 3 for Mayor and 2 Council seats.

Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.

To vote in this election, you must have been registered to vote by Tuesday, October 13, 2015. The Borough Clerk's Office will be open until 9 p.m. on October 13 for Late Night Voter Registration.

Vote by Mail Ballots are obtained through the Bergen County Clerk's Office in Hackensack. To have a Vote by Mail Ballot mailed to you, you must submit a *Vote by Mail Ballot Application* by October 26 to the Bergen County Clerk. After October 26, and until 3 p.m. on November 2, 2015, you may appear in person at the Bergen County Clerk's office to obtain and execute your Vote by Mail Ballot at that time. Call the County Clerk at 201-336-7020 for office hours. *Vote by Mail Ballot Applications* are available at the Tenafly Borough Clerk's office in Borough Hall.

Reminder: Once you have been issued a Vote by Mail Ballot, you can only vote via Vote by Mail Ballot at that election. All Ballots must be returned to the Bergen County Board of Elections by 8 p.m. on Election night. The Tenafly Borough Clerk can not accept Vote by Mail Ballots at her office.

Registered Tenafly voters will be receiving their sample ballots from the County Clerk's office within a few days of the election. In addition to the candidates running for office and public questions, the sample ballot also includes your Election District and address of your polling site.

Also, please note the changes to the polling districts for registered voters in Districts 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12.



OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

Choosing to Take Shelter is Necessary in Some Emergencies



Taking appropriate shelter is critical in times of disaster. Sheltering is appropriate when conditions require that you seek protection in your home, place of employment, or other locations when disaster strikes. Sheltering outside the hazard area could include staying with friends or relatives, seeking commercial lodging, or staying in a mass care facility operated by disaster relief groups.

To shelter effectively, you must first consider the type of hazard and then choose a place in your home or other building that is safe for that specific hazard. For example, for a tornado, a room should be selected that is in a basement or an interior room on the lowest level away from corners, windows, doors, and outside walls. The safest locations to seek shelter vary by hazard. **Be Informed** about the sheltering suggestions for each hazard. There may be situations, depending on your circumstances and the nature of the disaster, when it's simply best to stay where you are and avoid any uncertainty about safety conditions outside by "sheltering in place".

The length of time you are required to take shelter may be short, such as during a tornado warning, or long, such as during a winter storm or a pandemic. It is important that you stay in the shelter until local authorities say it is safe to leave. Additionally, you should take turns listening to radio broadcasts and maintain a 24-hour safety watch.

Bergen County provides shelters in several locations throughout the county based upon the need. Tenafly has been awarded a grant to install emergency generators that will service the Senior Center and McCandless Room. Once installed these areas will become operational shelters. The Red Cross has approved several locations in the Borough to be used as shelters. We will provide additional information as our plans become finalized.

You can receive important lifesaving alerts no matter where you are - at home, at school, at work, or even on vacation. Public safety officials use timely and reliable systems to alert you and your family in the event of natural or man-made disasters. SEWER STOPPAGES

The owner/occupants of premises in the Borough shall be responsible for proper maintenance and repair of all house sewer connections between the dwelling and the main sanitary sewer line. The most common causes of sewer stoppages are: grease, hair, disposable wipes, paper towels, foreign objects, and tree root growth. Please refrain from disposing any of these items into the sanitary sewer system. Remember that sewer pumps are not permitted to discharge into the sanitary sewer system.

In case a stoppage in the sanitary sewer occurs, the owner/occupant shall *immediately* notify the Tenafly DPW which will make an inspection of the main sewer line. If the main sewer line is obstructed, it shall be the responsibility of the DPW to remove the obstruction. If the main sewer line is not obstructed, the DPW shall immediately **notify the owner/occupant to proceed with removal of the obstruction in the house sewer line.** **IN ALL CASES, CALL THE DPW FIRST!**

TO REPORT A SEWER STOPPAGE: CALL DPW at 201-568-4134, 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

All other hours, including weekends and holidays – CALL Tenafly Police Department at 201-568-5100. The Police Department will notify the DPW.

GRASS CLIPPINGS

Grass clippings are collected by the DPW from April 15th to October 15th at the curb from residential properties on the schedule shown below. Grass clippings and leaves **ONLY** must be placed at the curb the night before pickup in **reusable containers with lids** provided by the property owner, not to exceed a 20-gallon capacity. Do not use blue recycling containers for grass clippings. Grass placed in bio-degradable paper bags will be accepted.

Grass clippings placed in plastic bags will not be collected under any circumstances.

GRASS CLIPPINGS PICK-UP SCHEDULE

- West Side: Zones 3 and 4 - Grass picked up on MONDAYS only
- East Side: Zones 1 and 2 - Grass picked up on TUESDAYS only

FALL LEAF COLLECTION REMINDERS

Townwide leaf collection begins October 15 and runs to December 1. The Department of Public works collects only leaves and grass that are placed loosely at the curb. According to N.J. Stormwater Regulations, leaves must be placed at the curb no closer than ten (10) feet from a storm drain inlet. Do not cover storm drains. Please do not put brush, twigs, branches or any other foreign matter into these piles. It not only makes the job more difficult and dangerous, but also contributes to the breakdown of our leaf collection equipment. Do not park on or close to leaf piles as it obstructs equipment access to picking up the leaves. If you choose to bag your leaves, they must be put into biodegradable paper bags only. Please call the DPW at 201-568-4134 to have the bags picked up. Plastic bags will not be collected under any circumstances.

Branches and twigs must be separated. These are collected by Waste Industries on your regular garbage collection day. Branches, twigs and garden refuse should be placed in a reusable container (not larger than 30 gallon capacity) with lid at the curb for pickup. Branches must be no longer than 3 feet in length and should be tied in bundles or neatly stacked at the curb for pickup by Waste Industries on regular garbage collection days. For skipped garbage pickup call Waste Industries at 201-567-3100.



WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REGULATIONS

After leaf season, the main priority of the DPW is to keep borough streets clear of snow and ice. Residents can help by not throwing snow onto the streets. It is against Borough Code to shovel or plow snow onto the streets. The reason for this prohibition is **SAFETY** – as snow melts and refreezes it causes icy spots that can cause serious accidents.

Snow removal regulations (*Borough Ordinance 12-3*) require property owners and/or tenants to clear snow from sidewalks within 12 hours of daylight after snow has stopped, or within 8 hours of daylight after snow has stopped in business districts B1 and B2. If snow or ice is so frozen to the sidewalks as to make complete removal impractical, the ice or snow must be covered with sand or salt.

If a fire hydrant is located on your property, snow or ice must be removed within 24 hours in residential districts, or 8 hours in business districts. You can help protect lives, homes and businesses in an emergency by keeping these hydrants clear.

Residents are asked to instruct private contractors engaged in the snow plowing of their property to not push the snow into the street. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or private contractor to throw, place or deposit snow or ice that has accumulated on private property, including private driveways, upon streets in the Borough. As snow melts and refreezes, it causes icy spots that can cause accidents.


Violators of these regulations are subject to issuance of summons and possible fine.
