THE 2015 MUNICIPAL BUDGET PASSES INTRODUCTION

The 2015 Municipal Budget was introduced by the Mayor and Council at a public meeting held on March 24, 2015. Prior to introduction, the governing body held a series of budget deliberation meetings on February 7, February 17, February 21, and March 9, 2015. All meetings were convened in the Richard D. Wilson Committee Room at Borough Hall. The two Saturday sessions were convened from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., and the weeknight session was held on Tuesday from 7:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. The final meeting on March 9, 2015, was convened as part of a regular Council Work Session. The sessions consisted of in-depth reviews of the budget recommendations prepared by the Borough Administrator and Chief Financial Officer. All Borough Department Heads met with the governing body to review his/her budgets and respond to questions concerning goals, objectives, and spending history. Managers were also requested to justify expenditures for new initiatives, where applicable. Copies of the preliminary budget were made available for public review at Borough Hall and the Tenafly Public Library. The final budget meeting on March 9, 2015, included presentations and question & answer sessions with representatives from the Borough's Auditing firm of Lerch, Vinci and Higgins; and the Bond Counsel firm of Kraft & Capizzi. The purpose was to review proposed budget changes requested in the budget hearings, approve the list of 2015 capital projects, and to examine the Borough's fiscal status with regard to surplus, bonding and debt service. The financial professionals expressed positive comments about the Borough's handling of its fiscal affairs.

This is the Borough's fifth budget prepared under the "Property Tax Levy Cap" which places a 2% CAP on the allowable amount to be raised by taxation to support the municipal budget in 2015. Additionally, total budget appropriation increases may not exceed 3.5% in accordance with the Appropriation CAP, which was already in place under New Jersey budget statutes. The 2015 operating budget was developed in compliance with these strict limitations.

At the time the budget was introduced, the proposed tax levy for 2015 will increase by \$192,500 from \$22,240,337 in 2014 to \$22,432,837 which equates to .9%. This is substantially lower than the 2% maximum allowable levy increase permitted by the state based on the local tax levy cap law. This change in the levy includes an increase in revenue (\$370,491) and an increase in appropriations (\$562,991).

The total 2015 property assessment valuation for the Borough is \$3,882,419,347; an increase of \$18,821,327 over 2014. Based on the 2015 assessed valuation, the \$192,500 tax levy increase equates to a municipal tax rate of .578; an increase of .003 over 2014 or .6%. This would result in an average tax per home of \$4,536; an increase of \$22 over 2014 based on the 2015 average assessed valuation.

From the Desk of the Mayor...



NEWS FROM THE TENAFLY POLICE DEPARTMENT

LIGHTNING DETECTION SYSTEM



The police department would like to remind residents of the Borough Code that requires all persons to clear Borough parks, fields and open spaces when the lightning detection system is activated. Users of these facilities are required to vacate all open Borough properties and seek immediate shelter from the weather event that is causing the activation. If no facilities or automobiles are available to shelter in, do your best to clear from the open areas, and remember that trees are not suitable safe alternatives to shelter under. While the Borough code covers all municipal owned and controlled properties, this practice is strongly encouraged for all other areas.

As a reminder, the first activation sounds a long 15-second horn blast that alerts all users to quickly clear all open areas and to seek shelter immediately. The horn blast starts a 30-minute activation period. The 30-minute activation period is reset for each subsequent lightning strike that is detected within the predetermined monitored zone. If you're not present for the initial horn blast, the flashing strobe lights atop of the detection devices are an indicator of an activated system. The strobe lights will continue to flash until a 30-minute period of no additional lightning activity has expired. When that occurs, three short 5-second horn blasts will sound, giving the all clear signal.



PEDESTRIAN CROSSING SAFETY

The department has received several complaints from residents who claim vehicles aren't stopping or yielding to them when they attempt to cross the street in marked crosswalks and at intersections. Motorists are reminded of their obligation to stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the roadway. The department will be stepping up pedestrian safety enforcement patrols to address the problem. One of the methods the department will be employing to address the issue is the pedestrian decoy program. The pedestrian decoy program utilizes a plain clothed officer to cross the roadway to measure motorist compliance. Motorists who fail to stop or yield to pedestrians will be stopped by a waiting police officer who observes the violation, or who is signaled by the plain clothed officer of the violation.



DOWNTOWN PARKING ENFORCEMENT

The police department will be looking to expand its enforcement of parking violations in the downtown area based upon repeated requests to do so from the public. Many vehicles park in excess of the time limits on Borough streets and parking lots in the downtown area which result in limited parking opportunities for patrons seeking to shop in town. Be sure to adhere to the posted parking restrictions on all streets and parking lots. The goal of the department is to obtain compliance rather than issue summonses. INFORMATION FROM THE TENAFLY FIRE DEPARTMENT



FIRE HYDRANT MARKERS

The Fire Department is installing the hydrant markers on all of the fire hydrants in Tenafly.

These markers are a valuable piece of equipment for the Fire Department when it comes to locating a fire hydrant that has been buried by snow. These reflective markers make the location of the hydrant visible when time counts.



Early Seasonal Request

The Fire Department also asks that any resident who has a fire hydrant in the vicinity of their home or business assist the community by clearing snow away from the hydrant when they are covered with snow for next winter.

BARBECUE SEASON IS UPON US...

As the barbecue season descends upon us, the Tenafly Fire Department wants to remind residents that utilize grills, hibachis and barbecues to continue to be aware of the fire risk. On average, fires from barbecuing results in more injuries and higher dollar losses when compared to all other fires. It is crucial that each person diligently practice fire safety when cooking or grilling outside. Please review the fire safety tips below:

- ✓ Make sure all connections on a gas grill are secure and periodically check hose lines for damage.
- ✓ Grills should be placed at least 15 feet from any home, building or combustibles to ensure adequate air circulation.
- ✓ Charcoal must be kept dry. Wet charcoal can spontaneously ignite. Spare propane bottles should be stored outside away from the home.
- ✓ Keep children and pets away from the grill. Grills continue to give off heat long after cooking has stopped.
- ✓ Never place hot ashes in paper or plastic bags or containers. Use only metal containers for hot ashes.
- ✓ Never use a grill on apartment or condominium balconies. This practice is one of the biggest dangers with grills. It is unsafe and against the law.


HOLIDAY SCHEDULE – GARBAGE COLLECTION

BOROUGH PROCEDURES FOR DISPOSAL OF GARDEN REFUSE, GRASS, TREE BRANCHES AND LIMBS



Now that spring and summer are here, please keep in mind the following schedule and procedures for yard clean-up and maintenance

DPW GRASS PICKUP

Mondays – Zones 3 & 4 – west side of Tenafly

Tuesdays – Zones 1 & 2 – east side of Tenafly

- Garden refuse and small branches are picked up by Waste Industries from containers placed at the curb on your regular garbage collection days.
- Large branches must be securely tied in bundles, with a maximum length of 3 feet, and placed at the curb for pickup by Waste Industries on your regular garbage collection days.
- For skipped waste pickup, please call Waste Industries at 201-567-3100.
- Grass will be picked up at the curb by Tenafly DPW from April 20th to October 13th from reusable containers with lids. Containers must not be larger than 20 gallons in size. No plastic bags will be picked up under any circumstances. However, grass placed in bio-degradable paper bags is acceptable.

THE TENAFLY GREEN TEAM SUPPORTS OUR SUSTAINABILITY



The Green Team was created to help Tenafly accumulate points by achieving Sustainable Jersey Actions. RECYCLING TIPS FROM THE TENAFLY GREEN TEAM



Please:

- Rinse your containers to remove food debris and liquid
- Only put acceptable items into your recycling bins
- Put your bins out for collection the night before
- Place shredded paper in paper bags

Do Not:

- DO NOT place plastic bags, plastic film, shrink wrap or bubble wrap in your recycle bins!
- DO NOT put any recyclables in plastic bags!
- DO NOT place soiled recyclables in your bins!
- DO NOT put metal pots, pans, bowls, utensils, cookware or metal or plastic hangers in curbside recycle bins (bring to TRCC-Tenafly Recycling & Convenience Center)
- DO NOT put fluorescent or CFL bulbs in curbside recycle bins (bring to TRCC-Tenafly Recycling & Convenience Center)

Reduce your garbage as much as possible. Buy products with less packaging or packaging that can be recycled. Buy only what you need.

Reuse items as many times as you can. By reusing items we save the natural resources needed to make them and we save space in our landfills. Donate unwanted items instead of throwing them away.

Who hasn't forgotten where they parked their car at the mall? Did you ever misplace your house keys? School friend stood up your child while hanging out at CVS?

Most of us know how and when to ask for help or directions, but families of youngsters with developmental disabilities, for example, know that their children need extra strategies to make their needs known, particularly in stressful circumstances. Even the

most well intended strangers don't always understand how to help.

Stories in the national news feature individuals who have been at a loss to identify themselves, or worse.

Carrying a photo ID and having a means to gain the necessary help can be a lifesaver and is worth teaching at an early age. At a minimum, it is a teaching tool for use later in life.

Here in Tenafly, we have the Community ID card for people with special needs. It is easy to register for and is tied to an existing program called the Special Needs Program, which alerts emergency responders of a registrant's needs once the confidential file is accessed.
