PUBLIC SAFETY INFORMATION

The Tenafly Police Department would like to inform our residents about an uptick in home burglaries and car thefts that have recently affected the Borough and surrounding communities.

Residents are encouraged to view information on *Home Security & Burglary Prevention* by visiting the *News & Public Information* link on the Police Department's webpage via www.tenaflynj.org. Residents should also be reminded that the Police Department's Detective Bureau offers free home security surveys. The surveys are designed to identify potential security vulnerabilities with your home, business or structure, and to provide recommendations to reduce or remedy the issues, if any exist. Residents that are interested in the service should email Detective Sergeant Wayne Hall at whall@tenafly.net, or call 201-568-5100.

With respect to the auto thefts, nearly every instance in the Borough over the last few years involved the vehicle being unlocked with the key fob left in the vehicle. As a result, the department urges all residents to lock their vehicles and remove the key fobs. This simple practice will reduce most, if not all of the thefts we are currently experiencing.

The Department would also like to take this opportunity to remind residents that the Borough's public and private schools are back in session. While driving lawfully and safely needs to always be the highest priority for all drivers, extra caution must be exercised during this time of year. Motorists need to be extra watchful for the increased vehicles, pedestrians, and bicyclists on the roads, sidewalks, and crosswalks. Lastly, don't forget our crossing guards and your requirement to follow their directions. The department thanks all of you for your anticipated cooperation.

2016 ELECTION INFORMATION

Borough Hall will be closed on Tuesday, November 8th as Presidential Election Day is a Borough-designated holiday for administrative employees.

The Borough Clerk's Office will be open for Election functions only.

This year's General Election ballot will include two (2) Council seats and a referendum question on extending the municipal open space trust fund.

Polls are open from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.

To vote in this election, you must have been registered to vote by Tuesday, October 18, 2016. The Borough Clerk's Office will be open until 9 p.m. on October 18th for Late Night Voter Registration.

Vote by Mail Ballots are obtained through the Bergen County Clerk's Office in Hackensack. To have a Vote by Mail Ballot mailed to you, you must submit a Vote by Mail Ballot Application by November 1st to the Bergen County Clerk. After November 1st, and until 3 p.m. on November 7, 2016, you may appear in person at the Bergen County Clerk's office and obtain and execute your Vote by Mail Ballot at that time. Call the County Clerk at 201-336-7020 for office hours. Vote by Mail Ballot *Applications* are available at the Tenafly Borough Clerk's office in Borough Hall.

Reminder: Once you have been issued a Vote by Mail Ballot, you can only vote via Vote by Mail Ballot at that election. All Ballots must be returned to the Bergen County Board of Elections by 8 p.m. on Election night. The Tenafly Borough Clerk cannot accept Vote by Mail Ballots at her office.

Registered Tenafly voters will be receiving their sample ballots from the County Clerk's office within a few days of the election. In addition to the candidates running for office and public questions, the sample ballot also includes your Election District and address of your polling site.

LEAF COLLECTION

Town-wide leaf collection begins October 15th and runs to December 1st. The Department of Public Works collects leaves and grass only that is placed loosely at the curb. According to N.J. Stormwater Regulations, leaves must be placed at the curb no closer than ten (10) feet from a storm drain inlet. Do not cover storm drains.

Please do not put brush, twigs, branches or any foreign matter into these piles. It makes the job more difficult and dangerous for our employees, and contributes to the breakdown of leaf collection equipment. To enable equipment access to pick up leaves, do not park on or close to leaf piles. If you choose to bag your leaves, they must be in biodegradable paper bags only. Please call the DPW at 201-568-4134 when bags are ready for pick up. Please note that plastic bags will not be collected under any circumstances.

Branches and twigs must be separated. These are collected by Waste Industries on your regular garbage collection day. Branches, twigs and garden refuse should be placed in a reusable garbage can (not larger than 30 gallon capacity) at the curb for pickup. Branches must be no longer than 3 feet in length and should be tied in bundles or neatly stacked at the curb for pickup by Waste Industries on regular garbage collection days. For skipped garbage pickup, call Waste Industries at 201-567-3100.



SNOW REMOVAL

After leaf season, the main priority of the DPW is to keep borough streets clear of snow and ice. Residents can help by not throwing snow onto the streets. It is against Borough Code to shovel or plow snow onto the streets. The reason for this prohibition is safety – as snow melts and refreezes it causes icy spots that can cause serious accidents.

Snow removal regulations (*Borough Ordinance 12-3*) require property owners and/or tenants to clear snow from sidewalks within twelve (12) hours of daylight after snow has stopped, or within eight (8) hours of daylight after snow has stopped in business districts B1 and B2. If snow or ice is so frozen to the sidewalks as to make complete removal impractical, the ice or snow must be covered with sand or salt.

If a fire hydrant is located on your property, snow or ice must be removed within 24 hours in residential districts, or eight (8) hours in business districts. You can help protect lives, homes and businesses in an emergency by keeping these hydrants clear. Residents are asked to instruct private contractors engaged in the snow plowing of their property to not push the snow into the street. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant or private contractor to throw, place or deposit snow or ice that has accumulated on private property, including private driveways, upon streets in the Borough. Violators of these regulations are subject to issuance of summons and possible fine.

We ask that you comply with these regulations for the safety of your family, friends and neighbors.

HELIUM AND BALLOONS – THE UNPLEASANT TRUTH

As the summer ends, our calendars quickly fill with parties and other festivities to celebrate a host of events – birthdays, championships, achievements, election campaigning and holidays – to name a few. Typically, helium balloons are prominent among an event's ornaments. The Tenafly Environmental Commission encourages you to think twice about using helium balloons due to the environmental dangers which they can present.

We've all seen how colorful helium-filled party balloons can lend an air of festivity to any gathering, but sadly, there's a downside to balloons that lasts much longer than the parties do!

When helium-filled balloons are released, they float away into the sky, often rising until they become invisible. But they will land eventually, and when they do, they become part of the ugly litter that pollutes the earth and the oceans. Latex balloons take years (or decades) to degrade. According to the Marine Conservation Society, more than 1,248,892 pieces of balloon litter have been removed from the world's beaches in the past 25 years. And that's not the worst part of it!


It's estimated that 10 percent of helium-filled Mylar balloons don't burst, but instead land intact on earth, at beaches, and in our oceans. Animals, both on land and at sea, are regularly starved to death by ingesting a balloon that blocks their digestive systems. More than a hundred of the celebratory plastic orbs were recently recovered from a wildlife refuge in New Jersey during a recent cleanup operation. These balloons were all found on one beach. We may view it as common litter, but unfortunately, those colorful burst balloon fragments often look like attractive meals to unsuspecting creatures.

In addition to potentially harming animals, free-flying helium balloons have also been linked to other hazardous situations including fires, power outages, and interference with air traffic.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service suggests that people celebrate with environmentally-friendly balloon alternatives like kites, pinwheels, and bubbles.

Remember, if you must use helium-filled balloons, don't release them into the atmosphere by simply letting them float away when you're finished with them. Destroy them and discard them with the trash.

The Tenafly Environmental Commission urges celebrants to use environmentally friendly alternatives to helium balloons.



The Mayor and Council's Access for All (AFA) Committee can help you understand, and access, the many supportive programs and services our Borough has to offer. We work closely with many Borough departments, including Recreation, Public Works, Police and Emergency Management, Education, and Buildings, to increase compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The mission of the AFA Committee is to ensure that ALL Tenaflly residents have equal access to everything Tenaflly has to offer. The AFA Committee has worked with the Mayor & Council to improve accessibility throughout the Borough. The AFA Committee's accomplishments include:

- Assisting Borough officials in the preparation of a Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan in order for the Borough of Tenaflly to satisfy the requirements of the federal regulations implementing Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act for municipal government facilities.
- Installation of automatic opening doors at Borough Hall and the Public Library.
- Construction of sidewalk ramps at various intersections throughout the municipality.
- Purchase of a self-contained handicap rest room facility for the Tenaflly Nature Center.
- Construction of handicap rest rooms at the Tenaflly Senior Center.
- Construction of East Plaza sidewalk and ramp to Library.
- Geissing Field track widened for wheelchair access; signage added to reflect right for wheelchair access.
- Community ID Card put in place for individuals with special needs.


