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TENAFLY POLICE DEPARTMENT ACCESS DURING CONSTRUCTION

Preliminary construction has already begun for the expansion of our Police Headquarters, and we will be forced to vacate our current building very shortly. Our department will still be accessible to the public, but there will be a few changes during the construction period.

1. **NOTHING** will change in terms of contacting us by phone. 9-1-1, and our regular phone numbers will remain unchanged and functional throughout the process.
2. As soon as on-site construction begins, the entire front of our building will be closed off including our regular entrance, parking lot, etc.
3. During that initial period, the public can access the Police Desk through the Borough Hall main entrance, even after regular business hours. During regular business hours, you can enter the Borough Hall and the receptionist will direct you to our desk.
4. After business hours when the Borough Hall is closed, the public will still use the Borough Hall main entrance to access the Police Department. There will be a buzzer and intercom installed enabling you to push the button and speak with the on-duty deskperson, who will then be able to buzz you into the building.
5. Within the next month or two, the entire police operation will be moved into temporary trailers which will be located directly across the parking lot from the Borough Hall main entrance. Once we move into that space, the public can come directly to the labeled entrance and speak with the desk person. It is anticipated that we will be displaced for 12-18 months until the project is completed.

The construction of this much-needed project will not negatively impact police response in any way. We ask that you bear with the increased activity along with the additional vehicular, pedestrian and construction traffic that will be created in the Municipal Center lot in the meantime.

POLICE HEADQUARTERS PROJECT HIRES CLERK OF THE WORKS

After awarding the construction bid to Santorini Construction LLC in the amount of \$3,090,000, the project continues to show significant progress even in the face of recent winter weather conditions. The construction permits and the Notice to Proceed have been transmitted to the contractor as January 20, 2011. Site preparation is now in active mode and work is visible in the Municipal Center parking lot on a daily basis. Project start up activities still in process include completing site preparation and utility plans and implementing the Police Department's temporary relocation to on-site trailers.

One of the most significant accomplishments to date has been the solicitation, selection, and hiring of a Clerk of the Works to oversee the coordination of day-to-day construction activities on behalf of the Borough. On November 22, 2010, the Borough received a total of twenty-two responses to a Request for Proposals for Clerk of the Works/Construction Management Services. The fee proposals ranged from \$67,500 to \$262,508.

From the Desk of the Mayor...

As we look forward to the New Year of 2011, your Mayor and Council acknowledge the challenges ahead of us in Borough Hall. The difficulties facing Tenafly are similar to those facing communities throughout New Jersey and in many other sections of the country. We are determined to reign in runaway property tax increases, but we are finding there are no easy answers. One example of this challenge are as follows. First, last year a budget decision was made not to hire temporary workers for the Department of Public Works.

These workers had been hired every year to assist with the leaf pick up process in the fall. Without these workers, and with the Borough hiring freeze which did not allow us to replace three other full-time workers lost to attrition, we quickly fell behind in the leaf pick up and leaves piled up on our roads unlike past years. We were fortunate that there were no early snows. Despite this significant cost cutting measure, residents saw no tax savings on their tax bills in 2010. In fact during the 2010 budget process, after over six months of hard work, we were unable to prevent an increase in our property taxes in 2010.

This year we have an opportunity to save money by reducing the garbage pick up service. After a serious study and negotiations with our contractor, we need to decide if a significant cut in this service will be acceptable to our residents when they will receive only a small reduction in taxes, and that reduction will not even take place until August.

To close, the job of governing has become much more difficult, but your elected officials are determined to maintain our high quality of life in Tenafly while keeping Tenafly affordable for all of our residents.

POLICE HEADQUARTERS PROJECT HIRES CLERK OF THE WORKS (cont'd.)

The Borough has selected Janeen McDonald, Principal of Dedicated Project Services, LLC, of Glen Rock, NJ. The firm's most recently completed assignment is Clerk of the Works for the Glen Rock Municipal Building Addition and Renovation, completed in December 2010. The project is comparable to the Tenafly Police Headquarters Expansion and Addition in cost and scope.

The Interview Panel, consisting of the Borough Administrator, Police Chief, and the Project Architect (Arcari & Iovino) unanimously agreed that Ms. McDonald demonstrated the best understanding of the overall project and the Borough's needs relative to oversight and execution. The panel also liked the firm's practice of working only on one project at a time for its duration. The firm was awarded a contract in the amount of \$73,500 at the Council Meeting on December 14. It was decided that the firm will also assist the Police Department in the coordination of procurement services for Voice, Data, CCTV, Access Control, furnishings, and other equipment for the facility.

Dedicated Project Services is now hard at work, and is already proving to be a great asset to the project. The project schedule anticipates construction completion to be approximately twelve months from start-up. The borough will keep the community informed about the status of the project as it progresses.

HOW TO DISPOSE OF BULKY ITEMS, FURNITURE, AND APPLIANCES

Tenaflly residents may arrange with Waste Industries, the Borough’s garbage contractor, to have curb-side pickup of certain bulky waste, furniture, and household appliances by appointment. Residents must make arrangements to pay the contractor directly for this service, and the resident must bring the item or items to the curb for collection. The cost in 2010 for each item was \$50.00. Residents may call the contractor at 201-567-3100 to schedule a date for the collection and disposal of: refrigerators, freezers, clothes dryers or washers, televisions, toilet fixtures, sofas, upholstered chairs, hot water heaters, stoves or ovens, window air conditioners, mattresses or box springs. Removal of Freon from refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners is the responsibility of residents. However, if you bring these items to the Recycling Center, it is not necessary to remove the Freon.

Tenaflly residents may dispose of these items at no cost by delivering them to the Tenaflly Recycling & Convenience Center located at 153 Grove Street from 7:45 am to 3:00 pm. Friday through Monday, 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm Wednesday and Thursday. The facility is closed on Tuesdays. Residents must obtain a permit or decal issued by the Borough to use this facility. There is no charge for the permit decal.

NOTICE OF CHANGE IN DISPOSAL OF ELECTRONICS

As of January 1, 2011, ALL ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT MUST BE RECYCLED. It is against the law to place them in your garbage as regular solid waste.
OUR RECYCLING CENTER HAS A CONTAINER FOR THESE MATERIALS.

WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REGULATIONS

The Borough's snow removal regulations require property owners and/or tenants to clear snow from sidewalks within twelve (12) hours of daylight after the snow has stopped. If snow or ice are so frozen to the sidewalks as to make complete removal impractical, the property owner or tenant must cover the ice or snow with sand or salt.

If a fire hydrant is located in front of your property, you must remove the snow and ice from around the hydrant within twenty-four (24) hours in residential districts and within eight (8) hours in the business districts. You can help to protect your home or business in case of an emergency by keeping the hydrant clear of ice and snow.

Residents are asked to instruct private contractors who are engaged to plow their driveways not to push snow into the streets. The regulations prohibit the pushing or throwing of snow into the street. It is unlawful for any owner, tenant, and private contractors to throw, place or deposit snow or ice that has accumulated on private property, including private driveways, upon streets within the Borough. Violators of these regulations will be subject to issuance of a summons and possible fine.

HUYLER PARK BANDSTAND RESTORATION COMMITTEE IS SEEKING DONATIONS


The bandstand in Huyler Park has had a long history in Tenafly spanning at least 100 years. All the mayors since its construction have stood on its platform along with council members greeting and addressing the local citizens. Memorial Day is one of the most celebrated holidays, when local war heroes and veterans are honored for their service. Marchers would line up on all four sides of the bandstand for speeches, after having made the trek which began at George Street. It used to be said that there were no crowds to cheer the bands and marchers along the parade route because everyone in town was already in the parade!

As with everything else, time took a toll on this treasured monument when the iron pipes began to rust and holes appeared, creating an unstable situation. When this happened, it seemed a simple solution to knock down the stone pillars and replace them with cement block walls. As time went on, these block walls were painted in an attempt to make a more acceptable appearance. In the process, the original design of this unique bandstand was destroyed. To this day Tenafly is scattered with old stone walls, many of which stand along the sites of former large estates. Local fieldstone and sandstone was also used in the construction of many houses in the area. Gateway pillars remain standing at the entrances to many driveways today. No other stone construction, however, was more prominent in town or singular in design than the bandstand in the park.

As far as dating the construction of the bandstand, early photographs give us clues. We know the bandstand comes from the beginning of the 20th century because trolley tracks laid in 1905 can clearly be seen in early photos of the bandstand in the park. The town was incorporated in 1894, and it seems reasonable that the bandstand was built nearer to that date to highlight civic occasions in this public memorial park, which at the time was only a short block from the first Borough Hall.

Contributions are being raised for the restoration of the bandstand from local citizens. Many Tenafly High School alumni from as far away as San Francisco and Arizona have responded with great enthusiasm towards this project, which holds so many memories. The bandstand played a great part in those memories - of the early Tenafly years of Memorial Day parades honoring Tenafly's veterans - of Glenn Miller, whose name is included on the War Monument in Huyler Park - of block parties and street dances which centered on the bandstand.

NEW BUILDING IDENTIFICATION LAW NOW IN EFFECT

Revised regulations for the numbering of buildings in Tenafly were established with the passage of Ordinance #10-25, and became law on October 1, 2010. The new regulations require installation of easily readable building numbers (building addresses) on all buildings. The primary purpose is to facilitate accurate and speedy building identification in case of emergencies and for providing services. The ordinance requires all buildings, residences and businesses alike, to be in compliance with the new law within six months of the October 1 date, which is March 31, 2011.

In general, the ordinance requires minimum 4 or 5-inch high x ½-inch wide building identification numbers (depending on distance from the street) to be placed above or within 10' of the main entrance to a building, on the side of the building facing the street. For one or two family dwellings, building numbers may instead be placed above garage doors facing the street. In some cases, building numbers may alternately be placed near walk or driveway entrances on posts or fences, provided certain conditions are met. Buildings with more than one entrance, serving multiple occupants or tenants, are required to have identification numbers at each entrance.

Official building numbers are assigned by the Borough Assessor and established on the Borough tax maps in conjunction with the Borough Engineer's office. Building owners that object to an assigned number may file an appeal with the Appeal Board. The ordinance further provides that the Construction Official may not issue construction permits until an identifying number has been assigned by the Assessor and that final construction approval certificates may not be issued until permanent numbers have been affixed to the constructed building.

This April, the Department of Code Enforcement will begin issuing violation notices to all building owners whose buildings do not have or properly display identifying numbers as required by the new ordinance. The ordinance can be viewed, downloaded and/or printed from the Borough website, www.tenaflynj.org, by clicking on "Code of Ordinances" on the home page and then clicking on Ordinance Books; 2010 Ordinances and Ordinance number 10-25. A SAFETY REMINDER FROM THE TENAFLY FIRE DEPARTMENT


