
TENAFLY TARGETS BETTER WELLNESS

On July 1, 2012, Tenafly pledged their participation in the Mayors Wellness Campaign (MWC). Mayor Peter Rustin joined over 350 Mayors who are playing a leadership role in supporting local opportunities for active, healthy lifestyles. The MWC is an initiative of the NJ Healthcare Quality Institute. Since 2006, the MWC has sought to develop and implement active living programs through local leaders and in doing so, to reduce health care costs and foster active living and healthy lifestyles for NJ citizens.

The Tenafly MWC committee intends to apply for a "New Jersey Healthy Town Designation". Only thirteen NJ communities have been recognized for demonstrating their commitments to wellness through Youth, Senior, Community and Employee programs. The Tenafly MWC intends to highlight the many sustained, ongoing activities that are offered through various local organizations. In raising the awareness of Tenafly's many healthy alternatives, MWC aims to brand the promotion of good health and to facilitate a cross-pollination of ideas and activities between organizations and individuals.

The Tenafly MWC committee intends to announce a number of initiatives beginning in the fall of 2012. Among the many ideas for programs that are being discussed is a walking event at the Tenafly HS track. Along with the obvious benefit of getting out and moving that day, the event would hope to provide a platform for local businesses to demonstrate their healthy features. The event will attempt to facilitate the organization of a group of walkers who would like to gather on a regular basis to walk the track, nature center, streets or other mutually agreeable venues.

From the Desk of the Mayor...

The Tenaflly Planning Board has sent the Mayor and Borough Council a proposed change in our Zoning Ordinances which would impact the continued development of new two family homes in Tenaflly. There is a potential for residents to misunderstand the intent of the Planning Board and the impact these changes would make on our town.

Over the past ten years, dozens of older homes have been knocked down and replaced with two family homes changing the look of many neighborhoods in Tenaflly. As a result of this trend, the Planning Board has received frequent complaints from property owners urging the Board to take action before the distinctive residential character of Tenaflly is permanently altered.

After a very lengthy and comprehensive study of the issue, the Planning Board has made recommendations to limit the building of new two family homes to a smaller portion of the community than what is currently allowed. The zoning on most streets that already have a significant number of two family homes will not change. Certain other areas where two family homes are currently allowed will no longer be zoned for the building of new two family homes. Existing two family homes will not be affected and should people wish to rebuild currently zoned two family homes, they would still be allowed to do so in the future.

These proposed changes have met with firm opposition from a group of residents; primarily those whose properties would be affected by the change; and their concern is understandable. Some real estate professionals are also opposed; but it is the traditional residential character and excellent school system in Tenaflly that is the foundation for their businesses.

On October 23, 2012, the Tenaflly Mayor and Council will hold a special combined meeting with the Planning Board from 7:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. to discuss this issue and other zoning matters. The public is welcome to attend and to be heard.

MAYOR & COUNCIL ADOPT RECYCLING CENTER CONDUCT RULES

The following set of operating rules was adopted on August 14, 2012 by Resolution # R12-311 to promote improved understanding regarding use of the Tenafly Recycling Convenience Center:

1. Visitors must adhere to the posted safe driving rules and signs guiding traffic flow within the grounds of the TRCC.
2. Lack of adherence to the rules regarding the drop-off of acceptable materials and the posted signs for using the appropriate containers is not permitted.
3. Illegal dumping of recyclable and non-recyclable materials at the TRCC during operating or non-operating hours is not permitted.
4. Hazardous materials are not accepted at the TRCC (Please request information concerning the designated Bergen County sites for these materials).
5. The removal of recycled materials from the Center by private individuals is not allowed.
6. Verbal abuse and/or threatening behavior directed at center employees or visitors will not be tolerated.

Violation of these adopted rules may result in the revocation of your decal and the loss of your privilege to use the Tenafly Recycling Convenience Center for a specified time.

PUBLIC WORKS SEASONAL INFORMATION



As autumn approaches so begins leaf collection. From October 15 to December 1, residents may put their leaves and grass loosely at the curb and the Borough will take care of removing them. Please **do not put** brush, twigs and any other foreign matter in these piles. It not only makes this job more difficult, but also contributes to the breakdown of our leaf collection equipment. If you choose to bag your leaves, they must be put in recyclable paper bags. **Plastic bags will not be collected.** Please call 201-568-4134 and we will come and pick the bags up.



After leaf season, our main priority is keeping the streets clear of ice and snow. As residents, you can help us by not throwing snow onto the streets. It is against Borough code to shovel or plow onto the streets. The reason it is prohibited is that as the snow melts and refreezes it causes icy spots that can cause accidents. Residents are responsible to clear their sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours of the completion of the storm.

TENAFLY AFFORDABLE HOUSING UPDATES

PURCHASE AFFORDABLE HOMES

The Plaza, located on the former Penetone site on Piermont Road, has constructed 145 housing units including 17 affordable units which are condominiums for sale. The 17 affordable units include 6 one-bedroom units, 9 two-bedroom units and 2 three bedroom units. Out of these 17 affordable units, 6 have been sold and 11 units remain to be sold. This project was granted final approval on November 10, 2004.

The Crossings at Tenafly located on the former Ippolito site along Grove Street, Mahan Street and West Railroad Avenue has constructed 44 townhouses which include 9 affordable units (condominiums for sale). The 9 affordable units include 2 one-bedroom, 5 two bed-rooms and 2 three-bedrooms. Five (5) of these affordable units have sold and four (4) have been rented. This project was granted approval on October 28, 2004. On May 11, 2011 the applicant appeared before the Planning Board and requested the Board lift its requirement that the units be for sale so that the owner has the flexibility to either sell or rent the units in accordance with the affordable housing regulations.

The Borough's 2012 Administrative Agent for Affordable Housing is Steven Weinberg, Director of Community Action Services. Mr. Weinberg has had all files transferred from Bergen County Housing Authority (the Borough's prior Administrative Agency) to his office and is presently working to compile a list of eligible applicants for The Plaza's remaining 11 affordable units. TENAFLY HOUSING REHABILITATION PROGRAM

**0% INTEREST LOANS. NO MONTHLY PAYMENTS. LOAN IS REPAID ONLY WHEN HOUSE IS SOLD.
HOMEOWNERS MUST MEET STATE INCOME GUIDELINES.**

The Tenafly Housing Rehabilitation Program (THRP) is sponsored by the Borough of Tenafly as part of the Borough's Affordable Housing Program mandated by the State. If your home is in need of basic repair, and if you meet the program income guidelines, you may be eligible. We offer housing rehabilitation assistance to low and moderate income Tenafly homeowners in the form of a deferred payment loan of up to \$15,000 for basic home improvements. The interest rate on these loans is 0%. The loans are not due to be repaid until the house is sold or title transferred. Funding for the program comes from COAH development fees that have been paid to the Borough since 2003.

The Tenafly Borough Housing Rehabilitation Program (THRP) can only help families whose income meets the current State income guidelines for 2012. Examples of maximum annual income limits by household size include: 4 persons - \$56,297; 4 persons-\$66,622; or 6 persons-\$77,281. The program's terms for Borough investor owners who provide rental housing to lower income families is set by the State and governs rent levels and tenant eligibility for 10 years. Funding is currently available for the first 31 housing rehabilitation loans. Applicants will be served on a first come, first served basis.

To apply for the Tenafly Housing Rehabilitation Program, first obtain a pre-application form from the Tenafly Public Library, the Tenafly Building Dept., 100 Riveredge Rd, or from the Borough's website at <http://www.tenaflynj.org> under Online Municipal Forms.

The Importance of House Numbers for Emergency Vehicles

In the case of an emergency, such as a fire, a difference in minutes can mean the difference between life and death. Fire fighters are equipped with many tools to help improve their arrival time. One of these tools is a detailed map of their designated area (s). However, house numbers are imperative for a quick reference. The more obscured and hard to find the numbers are, the longer it will take emergency personnel to arrive at the scene.

WHOOPIING COUGH, IT'S NOT JUST A COUGH!

INFORMATION PROVIDED BY TENAFLY BOARD OF HEALTH

Whooping cough hits epidemic levels in the U.S. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) says this is the worst epidemic of whooping cough, also known as pertussis, seen in the United States in more than 50 years. Health officials are calling for mass vaccination of adults.

Whooping cough is also known medically as pertussis. It's a highly contagious respiratory tract infection. Whooping cough is named for the "whoop" sound of someone gasping for air after a coughing spell. Although it can resemble an ordinary cold with a runny nose, fever, and cough, whooping cough may eventually become more serious, particularly in infants. About 40% of the infants who develop whooping cough will require hospitalization.

Whooping cough is most contagious before the coughing starts. A person with pertussis will most likely infect unvaccinated household contacts. The bacteria spread through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes.

The best way to prevent whooping cough is through vaccinations. Pregnant women should be vaccinated so their babies are born with some immunity. The whooping cough booster vaccine for adolescents and adults is called Tdap. This vaccine protects against whooping cough, tetanus, and diphtheria.

Recognized as a natural wonder in Colonial days and recently designated a National Park, the Great Falls of the Passaic River powered the factories of America's first great industrial city throughout the 19th and early 20th centuries.
