Mayor Rustin called the meeting to order with the reading of the Open Public Meetings Act statement:

"IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, P.L. 1975, chapter 231, THE NOTICE REQUIREMENTS HAVE BEEN SATISFIED. THE MEETING DATES FOR THE YEAR ARE CONFIRMED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING, ARE POSTED ON THE PUBLIC BULLETIN BOARD IN THE LOBBY OF BOROUGH HALL IN THE MUNICIPAL CENTER, AND PUBLISHED IN THE PRESS JOURNAL AND BERGEN RECORD WITHIN THE FIRST 10 DAYS OF THE NEW YEAR. THE NOTICE OF THIS MEETING WAS SENT VIA FAX TO THE PRESS JOURNAL, THE RECORD, SUBURBANITE AND NORTHERN VALLEY NEWS AND HAS BEEN POSTED ON THE PUBLIC BULLETIN BOARD IN THE LOBBY OF THE MUNICIPAL CENTER".

Joseph Frangiosa of the firm Arcari and Iovino, the architects on the Police Headquarters expansion project, presented the concept plans for the project. He was present this evening to seek approval for the preparation of construction drawings based on the concept plans presented this evening.

Mr. Frangiosa explained that the plans call for 9850 square feet of new addition expanding north of the current entrance, the renovation of 5100 square feet of the existing Police department, and 2050 square feet of existing space would be available for Borough Hall use. The current records storage space in the attic will not be affected by the proposed plan. Sixteen parking spaces would be lost from the front of the existing building.

Working with the Chief of Police, they are considering options for how the Police will continue to operate during construction. He noted further that the concept plans have been reviewed and approved by Hartman of the State Department of Corrections.

Following discussion, it was the consensus of the Council to have the architect proceed with construction drawings. A resolution will be added to the public meeting agenda tonight authorizing the preparation of construction drawings based on the concept plan submitted and discussed this evening.

There being no further business to come before the Council, on a motion from Councilwoman LaMastra, second by Councilman Lattif, and all present voting in favor, the meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
