The Spotted Lanternfly is an invasive insect, whose feeding kills trees and other vegetation. We need your help in efforts to control its population. Eggs are often laid on flat surfaces including tree bark, rocks, and lawn furniture. In addition, you will see the reporting tool you can use to report sightings to the state.
